A reconciling community is one that actively practices the ongoing work of peacemaking and Kingdom building. They are recognizable because they have a biblically-rooted approach to reconciliation, understand the context for reconciliation within their community, and engage in creative culture-making to become an agent of healing to others. 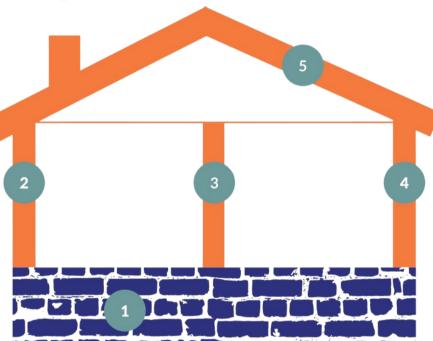
RECOGNIZING DIVERSE EXPERIENCES

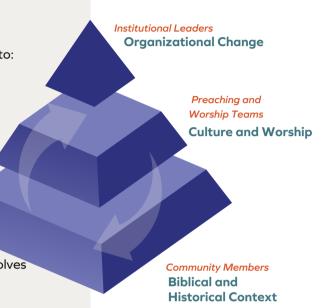
HOLISTIC TRANSFORMATION

In its work to help Christian communities learn and the Reconciling Community House, Arrabon takes a holistic three-tiered approach to:

- Equip institutional leaders for structural change;
- Empower preaching and worship teams to create new liturgies, music, and other ministry practices that build new culture;
- Educates community members with a shared language, knowledge, and biblical vision for reconciliation.

This three-tiered approach helps communities develop a flexible and sustainable pathway to change that fits their unique context, priorities, and needs at multiple levels

It also reinforces the idea that reconciliation is part of how we experience spiritual formation. That is, practicing reconciliation involves our whole self and community, and provides concrete and tangible opportunities to be shaped more and more like Christ.



COMMUNITY LEARNING
