Supporting Bridge-Building Leaders

- Arrabon supports executive leaders with "Pastoral Pauses"—supportive, shepherding, coaching conversations for senior leaders and their teams to have a safe place to discern how to navigate the rocky terrain of reconciling work.
- Arrabon also hosts retreats for bridge-building leaders, providing much-needed rest, renewal, and connection for continuing in the difficult but holy work of reconciliation.
